MINUTES:

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Wales Town Council held on August 5th minutes as written; Council member Nicholes seconded the motion.

INVOICES:

A list of invoices and financial statements for the month of August 2025 were distributed and reviewed. Council member Roberts made a motion to approve payment of the invoices; Council member Larsen seconded the motion.

BUSINESS & PETITIONS:

1. Appointment and swearing in of Doug McMullin as Wales Town Deputy Clerk.
2. Katy Jean Larsen – Request for water connection to Price property East of 200 E abt 50N (postponed)
3. Bill and Laura White – Request for reduction of water bill due to leak approved with 50% of overage

4. Caleb and Mikelle Drake - Request for reduction of water bill due to leak approved with 50% of overage
5. Natalie Howard – Discussion about noisy diesel trucks on Highway needing to restrict engine brakes. Signs to be posted or letters to offending companies mentioned but nothing was decided.
6. Town pickup/snowplow repairs are being attended to. Strobe light acquired by Council member Nicholes. Old truck bed to be sold off.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Mayor Introduced Emergency Preparedness and Shari Anderson requested a location to store the quilts. The mezzanine in the Fire Station was suggested as having lots of available space. Discussion of place for solar generators purchased to be stored.

Council member Brandon Rees reported by phone that the boost pump building is scheduled to be delivered by middle to end of September. Foundation work to begin in next week or two.

Council member David Larsen mentioned that roads need attention, but the budget is not adequate to attend to work. He is looking at companies to repair potholes. Further inquiry is being done with local residents regarding needing a four-way stop sign on 200 West and 100 South.

Council member James Roberts, more research is being done on costs for an awning for the front of the Town Hall.

Planning and zoning feel more inspections are needed on new building.

Organizing is being done to clear area for the library. Old copier is to go to the library.

Council member Hayden Nichols stated that a new sign is needed for the cemetery. Animal control is doing well. Sean Robison reported on Fire activity. Discussion was had regarding adding an new town ordinance about fire safety around buildings etc.

Clerk Washburn reported that he is still working on getting power to the two speed signs that have been installed in town. He is waiting for the county to inspect the installations before Rocky Mtn Power will hook power to the meters.

Council member Roberts made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Council member Nicholes.

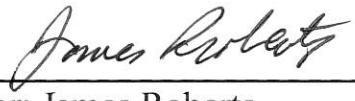
